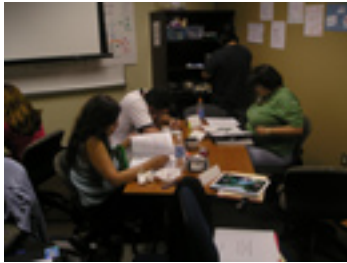


## SUMMER INVITATIONAL INSTITUTE

The San Antonio Writing Project Summer Invitational Institute is designed for experienced teachers across all academic disciplines. Invited teachers come from very diverse teaching backgrounds, and teach anywhere from kindergarten through university level academics.

The Summer Institute is an opportunity for professional growth and development, demonstration

of best practices, study of theory, and personal growth through writing. The Institute prepares teachers to teach other teachers to use writing in their classrooms effectively.

## APPLICATIONS

### Applications

Applications are available online at the SAWP website. The due date for applications is April 2, 2012. (UTSA Graduate School applications are also due by April 1, 2012.)

### Criteria for Selection

Successful and experienced classroom teaching.  
Commitment to using writing in the classroom.  
Desire and ability to teach other teachers to use writing in their classrooms.  
Willingness and openness to integrate new ideas and approaches to writing.

### Cost

Participants register for two Graduate classes (6 hours). A Fellowship from SAWP pays 50% of the cost, including tuition and fees. Approximate cost after Fellowship: \$1250.

## OTHER INFORMATION

Teachers participating in the Summer Institute will present a demonstration of a successful approach to the teaching of writing; therefore, applicants should have in mind some proven classroom activity that could be developed into a presentation.

After the Summer Institute, there are a variety of professional development opportunities offered throughout the year by SAWP.

The San Antonio Writing Project is an affiliate of the National Writing Project, which originated in 1973 as the Bay Area Writing Project. Today, NWP has over 200 sites across the nation whose purpose is the improvement of the teaching and learning of writing in our nation's classrooms.

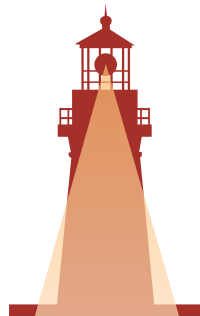

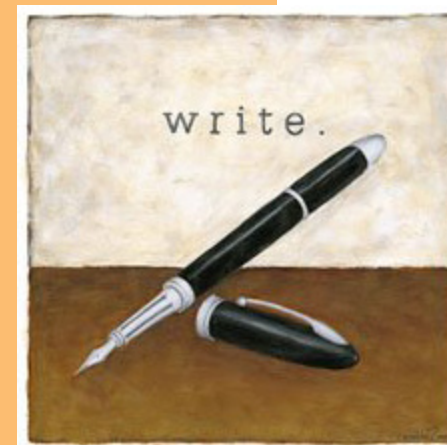
